Who are we?

• Forest Carbon Alliance Inc (FCAI) is a subsidiary company of First Resource Management Group (FRMG)



 FMRG is resource management company with clients across Canada and FCAI focuses specifically on climate action initiatives from tree planting and monitoring

What are we doing?

- We want to plant trees for the purpose of storing carbon.
- If you are the owner of cleared land that is sitting inactive, we want to work with you.
- We take care of all the planning and activities needed.
- There is no cost to you.



What is the land criteria

- Must have been cleared for 20 years, no recent harvest of trees of any kind during that time.
- Cleared land must generally be a minimum of 5 -10 hectares (12-25 acres).
- Can't already have obligations to replant or renew



What Species can be planted?

- Tree species will depend on the moisture and soil conditions of your land. We will send a technician to complete a site visit.
- We focus on establishing conifer and select from either red pine, black spruce, or white spruce.

What are the commitments?

• We work collaboratively to determine the area, species and site preparation needed for trees to grow. You can back out at any time during this process.

If participating:

- You must agree not to destroy the trees we plant and grow.
- You allow us access to your property so we can prepare, plant, and periodically check on the tree's health.
- There are no financial or in-kind contributions from the landowner required.

What are the timelines?

- Property assessments Spring/Summer/Fall 2022
- Site preparation prior to planting Summer 2023
- Tree planting in May 2024
- Possibility of follow up tending Summer in 2025
- Monitoring tree health 2025 2030







Do you use Herbicide?

- Yes. Herbicides may be required once during site preparation and tending.
- Herbicides are regulated by Health Canada's Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA).
- Must be applied by a licensed applicator, under specific temperature, humidity and wind conditions.
- Herbicides only work on the leaves of plants. It works by blocking growth process specific only to plants.
- We will not use herbicide without your permission.

What is Site preparation?

- "Site preparation" is used to describe any treatments of a site to prepare it for planting.
- Existing grass and shrub vegetation will overgrow and suppress the newly planted trees. we need to control that vegetation before tree planting or the trees will just die.
- Common site preparation treatments are:
 - Mechanical (mowing grass, brush cutting shrubs, disking furrows for planting)
 - Chemical (Application of herbicide by licensed applicator)
- We won't plant trees when the required site preparation is not done.
